

President Gerken convened the meeting of Hanover Borough Council on Wednesday Evening, April 22, 2015, 7:00 PM, in the Hanover Municipal Building, 44 Frederick Street, Hanover, Pennsylvania as advertised.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, followed by a moment of silence. Police Chief Smith welcomed Mrs. Jean Whitson and son Jeremy to this evening's meeting who were present this evening with formal police escorts. In their honor, Chief Smith presented a short video of the funeral for their husband and father, former Police Chief Randy Whitson, and on behalf of Hanover Borough Council thanked Mrs. Jean Whitson and son Jeremy for all their support throughout the term of Police Chief Whitson.

On roll call the following answered as present: Mr. Eline, Mr. Funke, Mr. Gerken, Mrs. Griffin, Mr. Marcoccio, Mr. McLin and Mr. Reichart; Solicitor Yingst; Mayor Adams; Manager Krebs and Secretary Miller. Councilpersons Morris, Roth and Yingling were absent.

It was moved by Mr. Eline, seconded by Mr. Funke to approve the minutes of Hanover Borough Council from March 25, 2015 as presented. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Funke, seconded by Mr. Eline to approve the bills, the Report of the Mayor and the Report of the Fire Chief. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Funke, seconded by Mr. Eline to approve the reports of the following Borough Administrators:

CITIZENS WITH ITEMS OF BUSINESS TO BE BROUGHT BEFORE COUNCIL

Mr. Troy Wentz, 230 DeGuy Avenue was present on behalf of a family member who became ill on March 10th, possibly due to a water quality issue. He stated the family member's illness was reported to the Borough the first week of April with documentation and Mr. Wentz expressed concern that the public was not made aware of the water quality issue until well after the occurrence. Mr. Wentz stated the course of treatment may have been different for his family member if the public were made aware of the water quality issue closer to the time of the occurrence. He complained that there was no signature on the letter of explanation that was posted on the website. Manager Krebs was first made aware of the situation in mid-March, and that was when DEP was notified. Manager Krebs stated she will check into the complaint, but to her knowledge, there were nine (9) telephone calls documented regarding the water quality notification, and none of them involved a doctor's visit due to illness. Manager Krebs stated that the first instance of water quality notifications was made in August of 2014 when there was an instance of high Tryhalomethane levels at one (1) location, but this occurrence was directly due to a change in Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) regulations; the levels would have been acceptable to DEP prior to their change of regulation. The Borough followed DEP protocol in developing all written and phone notifications.

There being no further public comment, President Gerken stated we will now proceed to the regular business of this evening's meeting, and no public comment will be taken until the end of the meeting.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to authorize PNC Capital Markets LLC, as underwriter, and Rhoads & Simon LLP, as bond counsel, to take all necessary and appropriate action towards refinancing the Borough's General Obligation Bonds, Series of 2010, including preparing and advertising parameters ordinances to be presented at Council's May 27 meeting. *This refinance represents an approximate savings of \$940,000.00.* Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to adopt Ordinance No. 2216 entitled “AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER, YORK COUNTY, PA, AMENDING CHAPTER 43 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER AND ALL OTHER CHAPTERS OF THE CODE IN WHICH REFERENCE IS MADE TO THE FIRE COMMISSIONER BY INDICATING THAT THE TITLES “FIRE CHIEF” AND “FIRE COMMISSIONER” ARE SYNONYMOUS AND THAT ANY REFERENCE TO THE “FIRE COMMISSIONER” IN THE CODE SHALL INCLUDE THE “FIRE CHIEF” AS DESIGNATED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL. SAID ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDS CHAPTER 43 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER BY AMENDING SECTION 43-2 TO INCLUDE THE POSITION OF DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF AND PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION OF A JOB DESCRIPTION THEREFORE.” On roll call, the following voted in favor of the motion: Mr. Eline, Mr. Funke, Mr. Gerken, Mrs. Griffin, Mr. Marcoccio, Mr. McLin and Mr. Reichart. The motion passed seven (7) to zero (0). Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to adopt Ordinance No. 2217 entitled “AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2188 BY REPEALING IN THEIR ENTIRETY THOSE SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 325 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER ASSESSING A TAX ON AMUSEMENT DEVICES AND JUKEBOXES, TOGETHER WITH THOSE SECTIONS WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF THROUGH REQUIRING THE FILING OF REPORTS RELATED THERETO; PROVIDE FOR ACCESS TO RECORDS AND PREMISES; PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF REVENUE GENERATED FROM SAID TAX; AND PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF;” *(Effective for the calendar year 2015.)*

Mr. McLin proposed an amended motion to adopt Ordinance No. 2217 entitled “AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2188 BY REPEALING IN THEIR ENTIRETY THOSE SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 325 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER ASSESSING A TAX ON AMUSEMENT DEVICES AND JUKEBOXES, TOGETHER WITH THOSE SECTIONS WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF THROUGH REQUIRING THE FILING OF REPORTS RELATED THERETO; PROVIDE FOR ACCESS TO RECORDS AND PREMISES; PROVIDE FOR ACCESS TO RECORDS AND PREMISES; PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF REVENUE GENERATED FROM SAID TAX; AND PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF;” *and in addition to write off all outstanding invoices for the amusement tax.*

Mr. Reichart stated he would not accept the amended motion by Mr. McLin.

Manager Krebs summarized the history of prior meetings from Committee discussion regarding the amusement tax including possible fee reduction from the current annual rate of \$50.00 per device to a proposed reduced fee of \$25.00 per device, with a \$2,000 annual maximum; the directive of the Finance & Personnel Committee to reduce the outstanding invoice of Timeline Arcade from \$5,400 to \$2,000 on September 24, 2014; and the final directive of the Finance & Personnel Committee at their meeting on March 18, 2015 to direct Hanover Borough Council to amend the ordinance to eliminate the amusement tax in 2015, but the Committee did not agree to eliminate any outstanding invoice(s), which includes the invoice of Timeline Arcade in the amount of \$2000.00. Manager Krebs noted all other amusement tax invoices have been paid to date.

On roll call, the following voted in favor of the motion currently on the table to adopt 2217 entitled AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2188 BY REPEALING IN THEIR ENTIRETY THOSE SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 325 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER ASSESSING A TAX ON AMUSEMENT DEVICES AND JUKEBOXES, TOGETHER WITH THOSE SECTIONS WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF THROUGH REQUIRING THE FILING OF REPORTS RELATED THERETO; PROVIDE FOR ACCESS TO RECORDS AND PREMISES; PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF REVENUE GENERATED FROM SAID TAX; AND PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.” Mr. Eline, Mr. Funke, Mr. Gerken, Mrs. Griffin, Mr. Marcoccio, Mr. McLin and Mr. Reichart. The motion passed seven (7) to zero (0). Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to approve the request of American Tower Corporation, Woburn, Massachusetts, for consent to sublease Ground Lease 21250 and subsequent leaseback of a portion of Site 153292, in reference to the cell tower located at 151 Railroad Street. Motion carried.

Finance & Personnel Committee – Mr. Reichart

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mrs. Griffin to approve a lease agreement for rental of a stall at the Hanover Market House for a period of one (1) year for Denise Fisher to sell baskets. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to approve an agreement with Hydro-Terra Group for monitoring of wells for the former Black Rock Landfill for the year 2015 in the amount of \$21,600. Mr. Eline asked if this is something that could be handled by staff; Manager Krebs replied negatively because DEP requires very extensive reporting; The Borough is in the third year of the contract with Hydro-Terra for this service. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mrs. Griffin to credit the following sewer billing accounts, one time only, due to leaks that did not enter the sewer system and have since been repaired:

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to approve the request of Judy Chamberlain to hold a summer solstice yoga class at Long Arm Dam on the grass near the boat launch area on Saturday, June 21st from 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM provided the area is policed for litter following the event. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to enter into an easement and right of way agreement between Russell C. Williams and the Borough of Hanover for the purpose of construction, use and maintenance of a 36" water line which runs from Kitzmiller's Dam to the Clear Lake reservoir. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to enter into a right-of-way agreement with Hanover Shoe Farms, Inc. for installation of water pipelines and for the servicing, maintenance, repair and replacement thereof. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mr. Funke to approve the request of Tammi Arnold, 420 Boyer Drive, East Berlin, PA to hold a wedding ceremony at Long Arm Dam on Saturday, June 13, 2015 from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM provided the area is policed for litter following the event, and a map of the area where the wedding will be held is submitted and approved by staff. Motion carried.

Public Safety Committee – Mr. Reichart

It was moved by Mr. Reichart, seconded by Mrs. Griffin to accept and authorize the certified hiring list of eligible police candidates as established by the Hanover Borough Civil Service Commission on April 20, 2015. Motion carried.

Public Service Committee – Mr. Eline

It was moved by Mr. Eline, seconded by Mr. Reichart to approve the request of the Hanover Chamber of Commerce to hold their annual Dutch Festival on Saturday, July 25, 2015 in the downtown area as per their Special Event Permit Application and fee of \$1,000.00, with certificate of insurance naming The Borough of Hanover as additional insured for the event. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Eline, seconded by Mr. Reichart to approve the request of the Visiting Nurses Association of Hanover & Spring Grove to hold their "VNA Hospice Remembrance 5K Race" on Saturday, September 12th, 2015 beginning at 6:00 AM and utilizing the Moul Field Recreational area including use of electricity and bathrooms as per their Special Event Request Application and \$500 fee provided that:

It was moved by Mr. Eline, seconded by Mr. Reichart to approve the request of The YWCA of Hanover for a dumpster at the Moul Recreational Complex on Saturday, April 25th, 2015 for their annual Kids' Day Celebration; and to block off the parking area along Moul Avenue. The cost of the dumpster to be paid by the YWCA. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Eline, seconded by Mr. Reichart to approve the request of St. Matthew Lutheran Church Youth Group to use Stawski Field at Moul Field Recreation Area for a softball game on Sunday, June 14th from 12:00 Noon to 5:00 PM (rain date Sunday June 28th) with use of the restrooms, provided a certificate of insurance is submitted naming The Borough of Hanover as an additional insured, the area is policed for litter following the event, and a \$50.00 deposit is received for use of bathrooms which will be refunded upon inspection of the bathrooms following the event. Motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Adams reported he attended the annual Arbor Day celebration on Monday, April 20th at the YWCA which was held indoors due to rain. The children from the YWCA Day Care were present and received a visit from Smokey the Bear. Before tonight's meeting Mayor Adams attended the Safe Home Vigil at the YWCA and read a proclamation for National Crime Victims' Rights Week. Mayor Adams reminded everyone that this Saturday is Kid's Day sponsored by the YWCA at Moul Field.

Mayor Adams read the proclamation which was presented to Mrs. Jean Whitson at the funeral of her husband, former Police Chief Randy Whitson:

WHEREAS, On April 15, 2015 the life of our former Police Chief Randy S. Whitson came to an untimely end; and

WHEREAS, Chief Whitson was courteous and considerate of the welfare of others and performed the duties of his position faithfully and diligently; and

WHEREAS, In his death, we lost a police chief, colleague, father figure, friend and beloved family man; and

WHEREAS, As a man and an officer, he leaves behind a legacy of good citizenship.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that this memorial be entered into the records of this Borough of Hanover and a copy be presented to the beloved wife and family of Chief Randy S. Whitson.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that I, Ben J. Adams, Mayor of The Borough of Hanover, York County, Pennsylvania, as a further show of respect, do proclaim that the flag at the center of town shall be flown at half-mast for a period of ten (10) days in honor of his legacy.

In witness thereof, I hereunto set my hand and cause my seal to be affixed this 20TH day of April, 2015.

Water Filtration Plant Supervisor Sterner described photographs of the recent progress of the construction at the Hanover Water Filtration Plant. She described the new "STEAM" programming, which is a resource for offering library programming in science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics. Director Kane thanked Hanover Borough Council for their ongoing support of the library.

On behalf of Hanover Borough Council, Manager Krebs congratulated Director Kane on receiving her Master's Degree in Library Science.

Manager Krebs asked for Council's guidance on the request from Borderline Bass Angler's for an upcoming Bass Tournament they wish to have on Saturday, July 11th at Long Arm Dam involving forty-nine (49) boats, requiring extra parking, and beginning at 2:30 AM. The fish are kept in holding tanks during the tournament then released back into the water at the close of the tournament. It was moved by Mr. Funke, seconded by Mr. Eline to deny the request for this large tournament. Motion carried.

Manager Krebs asked Council Members for comments or questions on the draft Outdoor Seating Ordinance which was distributed at Finance & Personnel Committee for feedback. Council members were in favor of the ordinance, so Manager Krebs will advertise the ordinance for placement on Council's Agenda at the May 27th meeting.

There being no further comments by Council or the public, it was moved by Mr. Funke, seconded by Mr. Eline to adjourn the meeting at 7:50 PM. Motion carried.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER, YORK COUNTY, PA, AMENDING CHAPTER 43 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER AND ALL OTHER CHAPTERS OF THE CODE IN WHICH REFERENCE IS MADE TO THE FIRE COMMISSIONER BY INDICATING THAT THE TITLES "FIRE CHIEF" AND "FIRE COMMISSIONER" ARE SYNONYMOUS AND THAT ANY REFERENCE TO THE "FIRE COMMISSIONER" IN THE CODE SHALL INCLUDE THE "FIRE CHIEF" AS DESIGNATED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL. SAID ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDS CHAPTER 43 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER BY AMENDING SECTION 43-2 TO INCLUDE THE POSITION OF DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF AND PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION OF A JOB DESCRIPTION THEREFORE.

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hanover, York County, Pennsylvania, as follows:


Section I: All references to the title "Fire Commissioner" in Chapter 43 of the Code of the Borough of Hanover and in all other Chapters and/or Sections of the Code in which reference is made to the "Fire Commissioner" shall include the title of "Fire Chief" or other position designated by the Borough Council as the senior executive officer of the Borough Fire Department.

Section II: Section 43-2 of Article 42 is hereby amended as follows:

- A. The Deputy Fire Chief shall serve as the person second in command to the Fire Chief.
- B. The Deputy Fire Chief shall represent the Fire Department in the absence of the Fire Chief and provide responsible administrative support to the Fire Chief. The Deputy Fire Chief shall have the specific duties; meet the specific physical, educational and experimental qualifications; and shall have the licenses, certifications, knowledge, skills and abilities as set forth in the job description as adopted from time to time by the Borough Council.
- C. The Fire Company fire duty officers, who may be elected from time to time by the volunteer companies participating in the Hanover Fire Department designated by the Hanover Borough Council to serve the Borough may be designated by resolution of the Hanover Borough Council as assistants to the Fire Chief. The Fire Chief may designate one volunteer fire company primary fire line officer known as "Captain" or some other designation denoting the fire line command officer or former such officer to act as Fire Chief or Deputy Fire Chief (as applicable) in the absence of the Fire Chief and the Deputy Fire Chief. Such designations must be submitted to and approved by the Borough Manager and ratified by the Hanover Borough Council. These appointments may be altered from time to time or suspended at the discretion of the Borough Manager, with Council's concurrence, at intervals of not less than one year.
- D. The duties of the assistants to the Fire Chief shall be to assist the Fire Chief in the performance of his duties under his direction and supervision.



AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2188 BY REPEALING IN THEIR ENTIRETY THOSE SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 325 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HANOVER ASSESSING A TAX ON AMUSEMENT DEVICES AND JUKEBOXES, TOGETHER WITH THOSE SECTIONS WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF THROUGH REQUIRING THE FILING OF REPORTS RELATED THERETO; PROVIDE FOR ACCESS TO RECORDS AND PREMISES; PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF REVENUE GENERATED FROM SAID TAX; AND PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Hanover, York County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

ARTICLE I

Ordinance No. 2188 is hereby amended by repealing in their entirety the following sections of Chapter 325 of the Code of the Borough of Hanover, being those sections imposing a tax on amusement devices and jukeboxes (as defined therein) and providing for the enforcement thereof:

1. Section 325-1 Definitions (with exception of the definition of "adult")
2. Section 325-2 Benefits excluded
3. Section 325-4 Amusement device and jukebox tax
4. Section 325-5 Report and statement required
5. Section 325-6 Right of accessibility and entry
6. Section 325-9 Confidential information
7. Section 325-10 Violations and penalties (but only as it relates to violations of the amusement device and jukebox tax).

ARTICLE II

From and after the date hereof the tax on amusement devices and jukeboxes is repealed and the officers and staff of the Borough shall take no further action to collect such tax.

ARTICLE III

In all other respects, the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 2188 and of Chapter 325 of the Borough Code are hereby ratified and confirmed.
