

## HANOVER BOROUGH SHADE TREE COMMISSION RECOMMENDED SPECIES FOR STREET TREE PLANTING

### ASH (L)

*Marshall Seedless*

(glossy, dark green leaves, yellow in fall)

### BALD CYPRESS (L)

(1/2" to 1" needles, orangy in fall)

### BLACKGUM/BLACK TUPELO (L)

(glossy, dark green, from yellow to scarlet in fall)

### CHERRY (S)

*Kwanzan Oriental*

*Mount Fuji White*

*Okame*

(pink flowering)

### GINKGO (L)

*male varieties only*

(fan-shaped leaves, yellow in fall)

### HAWTHORNE (S)

*Winter King*

*Washington*

(white flowering with 1/4" orange-red fruit)

### LINDEN (L)

*Little Leaf*

(heart-shaped leaves, yellow flowering clusters and nutlets)

### MAPLE (L)

*Crimson King*

(year-round dark red color with 2" samara)

*Autumn Flame*

(yellow to scarlet in fall, no samara)

*Sugar*

(yellow to scarlet in fall, 1" samara)

*Red Sunset*

(bright color stays late in fall)

### OAK (L)

*English*

(hardy, brown in fall with acorns)

*Northern Red*

(hardy, red to brown in fall with acorns)

*Scarlet*

(scarlet in fall with acorns)

*Willow*

(willow-like leaves, yellow to red in fall with acorns)

### ORNAMENTAL PEAR (M)

*Cleveland*

*Stone Hill*

(glossy leaves and white flowering)

### REDWOOD (L)

*Dawn Redwood*

(yellow to orange in fall with 1" cones)

### SCHOLARTREE (M)

*Regent*

(white flowering clusters into fall)

### SERVICEBERRY (M)

(white flowering clusters)

### SWEETGUM (L)

*Seedless*

(star-shaped leaves with brilliant varied shades of fall color)

### JAPANESE ZELKOVA (L)

*Green Vase*

*Village Green*

(bronze red to rusty red in fall)

### JAPANESE LILAC TREE (M)

*Ivory Silk*

*Summer Snow*

(Creamy-white flowering clusters)

(S) Small Growing Tree  
(M) Medium Growing Tree  
(L) Large Growing Tree

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The Tree Commission encourages home-owners to plant new trees in the plot between the sidewalk and curb after filling out a permit and getting approval by the tree commission. The Borough of Hanover has a program for providing and planting a limited number of street trees each year. However recent budget cuts have restricted the number of trees purchased. If the property owner is willing to purchase a tree, it can be planted by the property owner or by our Public Works Dept. If you are interested, please stop in at the Borough Office and fill out a permit.

\*\*\*It is the responsibility of the home-owner to water and care for newly planted trees for the first year after planting, whether the Borough or the home-owner plants the trees.
